

Colin Jones' trial wraps up

Final arguments in Colin Jones' trial were heard on Friday.

Jones is charged with knowingly leaving the scene of a hit-and run that killed 20-year-old Lindsay Giacomelli in March 2005.

The judge must now decide whether Jones is guilty or not.

Attorney Balfour Der said Jones was under a lot of stress and did not realize what he had done.

Doctors testified that under the type of stress Jones was under, it's possible that he could have experienced memory loss.

Crown Prosecutor David Torske argues that Jones was well enough after the incident to buy an airline ticket to England.

Torske says Jones left Giacomelli to die and if Jones is convicted, he should get jail time.

The judge is expected to read his verdict on April 11th.

If convicted, Colin Jones could face a maximum of five years in prison.
