The Lindsay Rachel Giacomelli Memorial Fund was established in Lindsay's name as a memorial to her short life (June 18, 1984 to March 18, 2005). The goal of the fund is to keep Lindsay's name and presence alive and to reflect her generous and caring spirit (www.lindsaygiacomelli.com).

The Lindsay Rachel Giacomelli Memorial Fund is an endowment fund administered by The Calgary Foundation; all contributions to the fund remain at the Foundation forever. Each year 5% of the fund's value is used for a charitable donation to a local cause. This donation amount is what the fund earns over the year as an investment. Previous donations have been made to the Calgary Zoo, the Calgary Military Museum Society, the Alberta Children's Hospital Foundation (the Rotary / Flames House), the Calgary Health Trust (Foothills Hospital ICU), and to Alberta Ballet. Total charitable donations to date total ~\$39,000 (including donations from our Platinum Sponsors).

This year we will have two primary donation recipients; the Alberta Children's Hospital Foundation in support of the Special Children's Fund, and the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry Regiment (PPCLI) Museum and Archives Gallery Renovation.

The Special Children's Fund at the Alberta Children's Hospital was established to provide financial assistance to lower income families for costs associated with the care and treatment of their child's illness. This fund helps families by relieving financial burdens during an already stressful time.

The PPCLI Regiment has approved major initiatives and renovations to be executed within the Museum over the course of the next 3 years to coincide with the Regiments' Centennial in 2014. The mission of the PPCLI Museum and Archives is to preserve, perpetuate and promote the history, traditions and heritage of the Regiment in order to inform, educate, and inspire Patricia's and the general public. The PPCLI Museum will enhance the public display of Regimental history, traditions and heritage, and provide the public with a readily accessible platform for the exploration of the proud and distinguished history of the Regiment.

RULES - TEXAS SCRAMBLE

- Each player hits their drive and the captain selects the best eligible drive and all players hit their second shot from that spot. Same with the second shots until on the green. All players putt from the selected shot that is on the green and continue from the best putt until the ball is in the hole. Putts within the leather of the Captains putter are considered gimmees.
- Each person on the foursome must use 4 drives. Threesomes use 5 drives.
- No consecutive shots until on the putting surface (fringe doesn't count). This means if player A's drive (or second, third shot) is selected, player does not use his/her next shot. Threesomes are exempt from this rule.
- Captains to keep track of the number of balls shot into the sand and water by each team member for the entire game. Put S's and W's on each hole that player puts their ball in the sand or water.
- The "pink" ball game.** The captain of each team starts his/her game with the numbered "pink" ball on the first hole of play, and plays the ball for that entire hole. The ball is then passed in succession (per the scorecard) to the other team members to be similarly played on the subsequent three holes, until all four members of the team have played the ball. If your team manages to get this far, continue playing on this pre-set team-member rotation for the entire game, or until the ball is lost. You can not change the order of play to 'protect' the "pink" ball. For those of you who are able to bring the ball back at the end of the game, turn it in with your scorecard. All returned balls will then be put into the 'ball pot' for a draw. The team that is drawn will get a 'special' team prize.
- No whining about the rules.
- Hole in One sponsored by Malcolm Page. The Novak Rule: for all players (except Jim Novak, as decreed by Malcolm) a ball within 1 golf ball diameter (1.680 inches) from the cup edge will be deemed as a Hole in One. Jim however, must have it in the cup.
- Prizes will not necessarily be given out based on scoring results.
- Play will be from the white tees (men) and red tees (ladies).
- The Scotch Marshall will be camped out at the Elbow No. 4 at the Techmation Tent, but will be touring with some fine Cuban Cigars.

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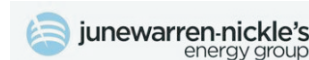
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
